The Education Abroad Office administers and supports all USF students engaging in an international education experience outside of the United States. While the majority of USF's students participate in a faculty-led program, the Education Abroad Office (EAO) also facilitates and administers independent research abroad, internships, service learning, and participation in semester exchanges in addition to experiences abroad organized by other universities or study abroad providers. All students (undergraduate and graduate), are required to go through the EAO.

Students Studying Abroad

The number of USF-System undergraduate and graduate students studying abroad during 2014-2015 was 1439 (unduplicated¹ head count, with USF non-degree students included). The number of undergraduate students studying abroad has increased by 1.05% from the 2013/2014 academic year to the 2014/2015 academic year (Fall 2014 through Summer 2015) going from 1051 to 1062 USF undergraduate students (duplicated with non-degree students included). The EAO saw an increase in graduate students abroad from the 2013/2014 academic year to the 2014/2015 academic year, from 369 to 377, a 2.16% increase. Overall, this allows our USF Students Engaged in an International Experience (Includes Puerto Rico & Virgin Islands) system percent increase to be 2.41% (1405 to 1439) from 13/14. As Table 1 illustrates, the growth in the Education Abroad is characterized by significant growth every other year with slight growth in intervening years. Since the 2007/2008 year the number of undergraduates participating in study abroad has increased by 86% (570 to 1062). Please see <u>Table 6</u>.

In line with the USF World Metrics 2013-2018 (<u>Table 1</u>), USF Tampa sent 3.22% of its undergraduate students abroad in academic year 2014-2015, exceeding the 3.1% goal. Even better, USF Tampa sent 3.61% of its graduate students abroad, exceeding the 2014-2015 goal by 0.76%. The 2014/2015 system number for USF Open Doors reporting is 1154², exceeding the goal of 1114.

In addition to the USF students, the Education Abroad office (EAO) has served a number of non-USF students participating in a study abroad program as well as faculty researching abroad for a total of 3026 individuals. Please see <u>Table 5</u>.

It is interesting to note that upon completing an analysis of USF Tampa degree-seeking students with regard to their ethnicity, the ethnic distribution of students who study abroad strongly mirrors the ethnic distribution of the USF Tampa campus as a whole. This indicates that we are successfully providing a broad range of program academic foci and locations that appeal to many different student

¹ Unduplicated count signifies that each individual is counted only once regardless the number of programs he or she attended. With the duplicated count, each student is counted based on the number of different programs a student participates in. There may be 15-80 undergraduate and graduate students who participate in more than one international education experience in a given year.

² OpenDoors numbers include only unduplicated degree-seeking students who participate in credit-bearing experiences. The report excludes non-US citizens for the purposes of capturing outbound mobility as they are counted though international students data (inbound mobility).

groups. While this is a continuing trend at USF, it is one that breaks from national trends in a positive way. Please see <u>Table 3</u> and <u>Chart 2</u>.

For the inaugural 2015 program, Dr. Stiling and six other USF faculty members from a variety of disciplines (art, business, English, political science, psychology, and the honors college) led 97 USF students.








